Darlene Jackson, 81 years of age, of Hiram, passed away Saturday, July 9, 2022 at UH-Geauga Medical Center in Chardon. Darlene was born on November 15, 1940, in Barnesville, Ohio, the daughter of the late Clyde and Annette (Downey) Coyle. Darlene was a graduate of GlenOak High School in Canton and had been a longtime Hiram resident. She was a recognized watercolor artist who held memberships in the Whiskey Painters of America and the National and Ohio Watercolor Societies and taught at the Valley Art Center in Chagrin Falls for many years. Darlene was a member of the Hiram Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). For those who knew and loved Darlene, her warm infectious smile, and the love that she had for her “grandbabies” will remain forever. On September 3, 1960, she married Dr. Robert Jackson who survives at their home. Also surviving are her children, Rev. Jeff (Audrey) Jackson of Hiram, Jennifer Jackson of Hiram, Janet Jackson of Tallmadge, and Her siblings Brian (Tracy) Coyle of N.C., Sydney Wagner of WI., Karen (Jim) Hawthorne of Columbus, Ohio and Amy Coyle of North Canton; 10 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren also survive. She was preceded in death by her brother Brad Coyle. A Memorial Service to Celebrate her Life will be held Wednesday, July 13, 2022 at the Hiram Christian Church with Pastor Chris McCreight officiating. Visitation will be at the church from 10:00 A.M. - 11:00 A.M. where her service will then begin. A luncheon at the church will immediately follow for family and friends.
