Gordon Leo Ober

SEP 16, 1949 - AUG 1, 2024

Gordon Leo Ober passed away unexpectedly at his home in Garrettsville, Ohio on August 1, 2024. He was 74.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 47 years, Elaine Ober, son Martin Ober (Colby) of Stow and daughter Claire Ober of Garrettsville; his grandson Wesley Leo Ober of Stow; sister LaVonne Bonin of Cincinnati and brother Nelson Bruce Ober (Joni) of Uniontown; many dear nephews and nieces and grand nephews and nieces. Gordon was preceded in death by his parents Austin and Martha Ober and by his brother Tom and sister Lynette.

Gordon was a proud 1968 graduate of Dalton High School. He received his Bachelor's degree from Kent State University in 1972 and an MBA in 1975. While at Kent he was a member of the track team and was the kicker for the Golden Flashes football team, holding four records for many years.

Gordon's professional career spanned nearly 40 years with The Davey Tree Company in Pittsburgh, PA and Kent, OH. He retired in 2014 as Vice President, Personnel Recruiting and Development. He believed in giving back to his community and was a member of Robinson Memorial Hospital's Foundation Board in Ravenna, OH, subsequently serving as President of the Board of Directors as it transitioned to University Hospitals Portage Medical Center.

An avid musician, Gordon was an accomplished pianist and organist, and loved all genres of music, especially classical. He was a member of the Chancel Choir at The Church in Aurora and sang in the chorus of the Orrville Community Chorus' presentation of The Messiah for sixty years.

A member of The Church in Aurora for thirty years, Gordon served as chairman of the finance committee; as an elder; and as the church's Moderator.

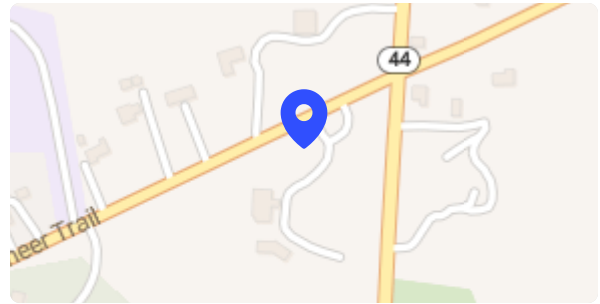

My heart ached when I heard the news. He is missed and I think of him often. Gordon and I were life long friends. We shared the same school bus all through elementary, camped together and hung out as neighborhood kids and played sports together. What a great man and a man of deep faith. We shared so many memories together. Gordon and I spoke about a month before his passing and he was going to stop by on one of his frequent visits to his hometown. About a year before, he had stopped by to see me. As kids, we had built a tree house in a huge maple tree. He wanted to see that tree. He struggled to walk back to that tree which except for a rotted out stump was no longer there. He seemed saddened by what he saw and the memories of our youth flooded back. His only statement was: "Where have the years gone?" I agreed and said it seemed like yesterday that we were building it. Daryl mentioned about Gordon's athletic ability but my special memory of that was his 40+ yard kick to beat North Carolina State at the end the game in Raleigh NC. I had transferred from Kent to a college in Tennessee and went to that game to see Gordon and my Brother Fred play. There were only about 200 Kent fans there and we all rushed the locker room after the game. Gordon was the hero. One more special memory of Gordon was shortly after Martin was born and we invited Gordo and Elaine to our farm for a cookout. Gordon put Martins tiny little foot into his mouth to show how small it was. He got the biggest laugh and kick of of doing that. To the family and friends of Gordon Ober, I just recently learned that Gordie passed away from his former Dalton teammate Dan Blosser. Consequently, I wanted to send my condolences to Gordon's family and friends and I hope this message isn't too late to be included in the Tribute Wall. Gordie was a special person and also a great athlete during his time at Dalton and Kent State. When he was at Dalton, I was an OPPONENT of his who played for Rittman and I remember vividly that he was an outstanding running back. In fact, the Dalton cheering section even had their own chant for him: "Ober, Ober, take it over!" And he happily obliged when we played them by scoring numerous touchdowns that evening (and many more touchdowns throughout the season). At Kent State, I was a TEAMMATE of Gordie's on the football team. Our coaches had recruited him from the track team because he could kick a football into the end zone as a kick-off specialist. Eventually, because of his exceptional kicking distance, they decided to try him as our field goal/extra point kicker. Around mid-season during his junior year, the coaches decided to use Gordie as our place-kicker for the first time against Western Michigan. Prior to that game, he'd never kicked a field goal in high school or college. But shockingly, Gordie let us to victory by kicking four field goals against the Broncos which also tied the all-time MAC record for field goals in a game - a truly remarkable accomplishment!! Obviously, after setting that record, he became our first team placekicker for the remainder of his junior year as well as his senior year. During those seasons, Gordie kicked several crucial field goals for Kent but none bigger than the game winning field goal he kicked against North Carolina State in which we upset the mighty Wolfpack at Raleigh. 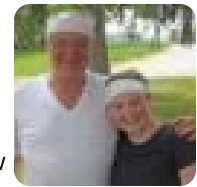
